## Claims

### 3. Setup

#### AC Power

The Cloud 9X IP has a fixed power supply that works with an input voltage of either 120 VAC, 60 Hz or 230 VAC, 50 Hz, depending on the specific model.

To determine the product's power requirements (circuit breaker, power outlet, and wiring), use the current value listed on the label affixed to the product's back panel, or refer to the product's specifications chart. The listed current rating indicates the product's average current draw under normal conditions.



- **Always connect the product to a protected circuit (a circuit breaker or fuse). Ensure the product has an appropriate electrical ground to avoid the risk of electrocution or fire.**
- **To eliminate unnecessary wear and improve its lifespan, during periods of non-use completely disconnect the product from power via breaker or by unplugging it.**



**Never connect the product to a rheostat (variable resistor) or dimmer circuit, even if the rheostat or dimmer channel serves only as a 0 to 100% switch.**

#### AC Plug

The Cloud 9X IP comes with a power input cable terminated with a Seetronic Powerkon A connector on one end and an Edison plug on the other end (U.S. market). If the power cable which came with the product has no plug, or if it is necessary to change the plug, use the table below to wire a plug.

#### Resetting the Breaker

This product is equipped with a resettable circuit breaker. If the breaker trips, all sections of this product will lose power.

1. Remove the power cord from main power.
2. Allow unit to cool for 15 minutes.
3. After 15 minutes, user may attempt to reset the breaker by pressing the button with their finger.
4. Plug the product's power cord into the power outlet and continue using as recommended.

#### Control Personalities

The Cloud 9X IP uses a 3- or 5-pin DMX data connection for its 1 control personality.



**If the user is not familiar with or need more information about DMX standards or the DMX cables needed to link this product to a DMX controller, download the DMX Primer from the Chauvet website: [www.chauvetprofessional.com](http://www.chauvetprofessional.com).**

#### DMX Linking

The Cloud 9X IP can be linked to a DMX controller using a 3- or 5-pin DMX connection. If using other DMX-compatible products with this product, it's possible to control each individually with a single DMX controller.

#### DMX Personalities

The Cloud 9X IP uses a 3- or 5-pin DMX data connection for its for **3Ch** DMX personality.



**For information about DMX standards, Master/Slave connectivity, or the DMX cables needed to link this product to a DMX controller, download the DMX Primer from the Chauvet website: [www.chauvetprofessional.com](http://www.chauvetprofessional.com).**

#### Remote Device Management

Remote Device Management, or RDM, is a standard for allowing DMX-enabled devices to communicate bi-directionally along existing DMX cabling. Check the DMX controller's User Manual or with the manufacturer as not all DMX controllers have this capability. The Cloud 9X IP supports RDM protocol that allows feedback to make changes to menu map options.

### USB Software Update

The Cloud 9X IP allows for software updates with a USB device using the built-in USB port. To update the software using a USB type C flash drive, do the following:

1. Download the latest software file, APP-OUTDOOR-CLOUD9.bin, onto the root directory of a formatted USB-C flash drive. To locate the file, visit <https://github.com/Chauvet-Pro>.



- **The product's USB port supports up to 32GB capacity and only works with FAT32 file format.**
- **Once the file has been downloaded, the filename cannot be changed.**

2. Insert the USB-C flash drive into the USB-C port of the Cloud 9X IP and turn on the product.
3. On the display screen, a progress bar will appear to indicate the status of the ongoing update. The progress is also display as a numerical percentage. Allow time for the software update to be completed.
4. Once the update is complete, a prompt will appear on the display screen to indicate a successful software update.



**The display screen may show an update summary such as APP CONTROL UPDATE, MCU IAP No Update, and Update Success.**

5. The screen will then display the starting menu.
6. Remove the USB-C flash drive from the product.

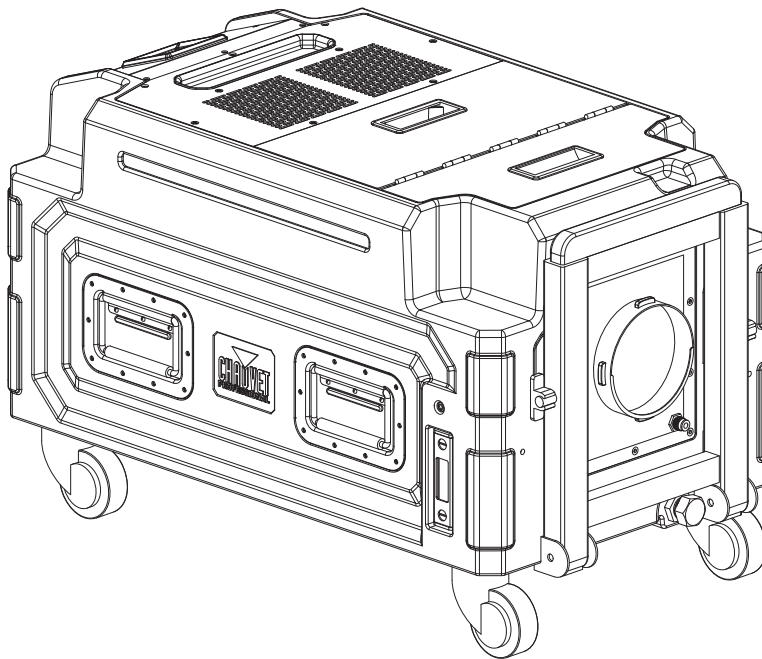

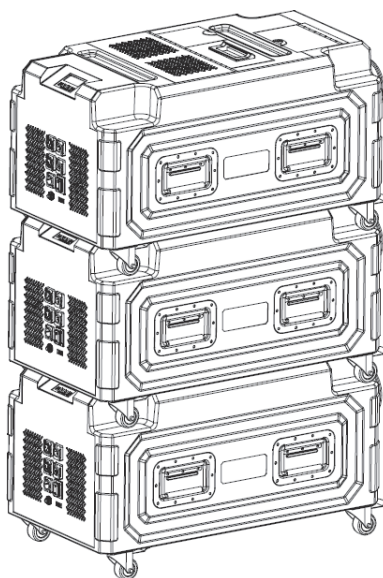

### Stacking Diagram



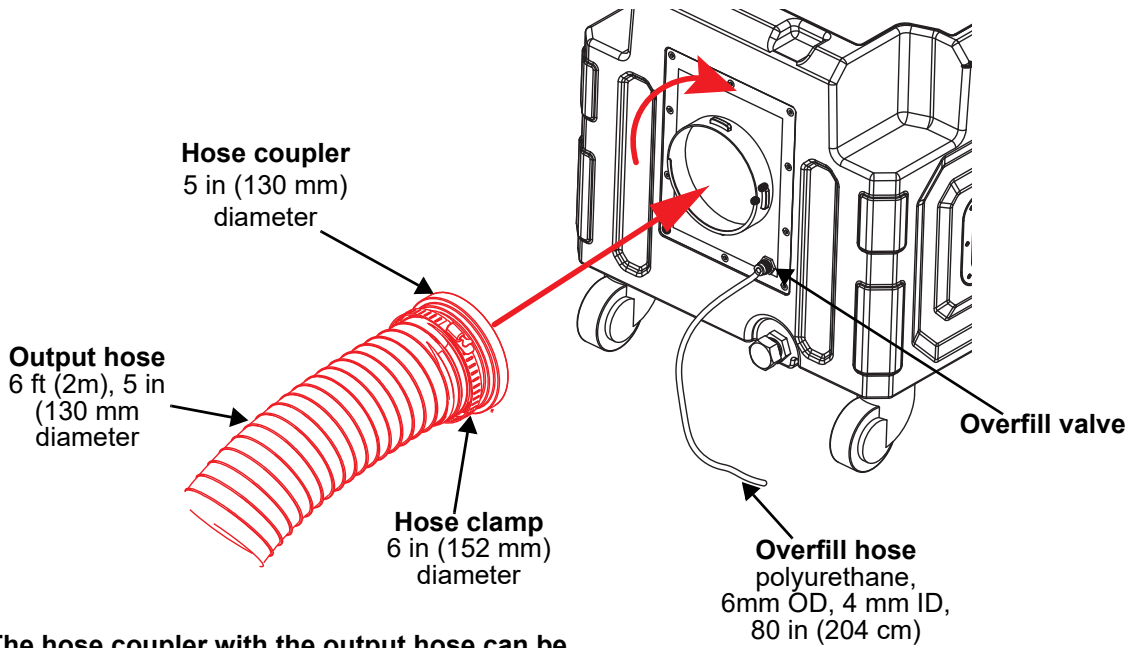
**Stack Mount**



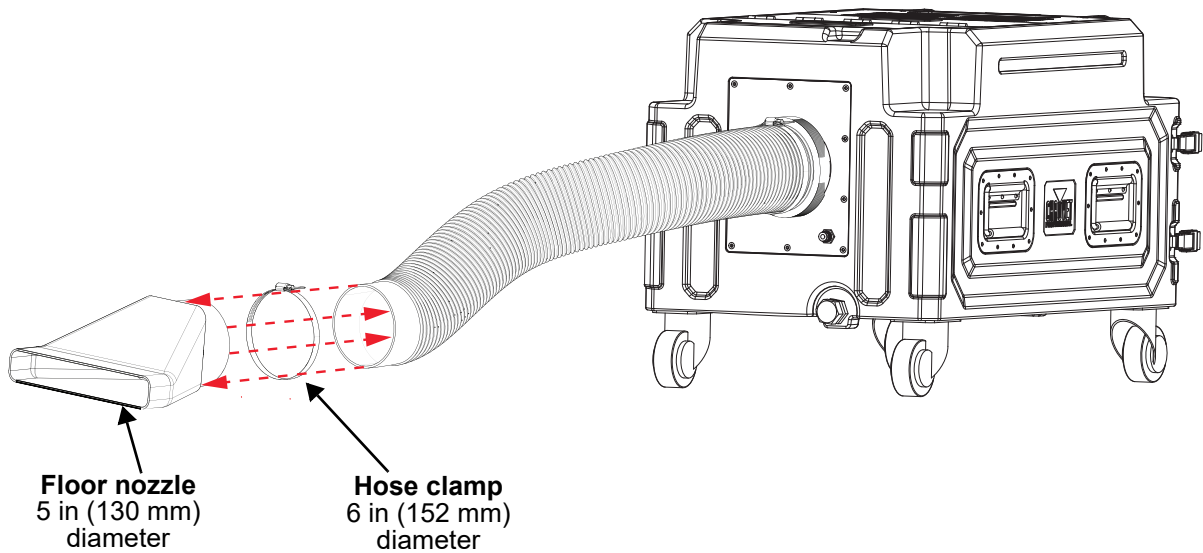
When stack mounting the Cloud 9X IP, do not exceed more than 3 products. Stacking units beyond this total may result in serious injury or damage.

## Hose Attachment

The Cloud 9X IP comes with a hose coupler, an output hose, and a clamp that attaches to the nozzle for a low-lying fog effect. To attach or remove the hose, use the hose coupler to secure the directional hose to the nozzle.



\* The hose coupler with the output hose can be attached to the unit with a ¼ turn.

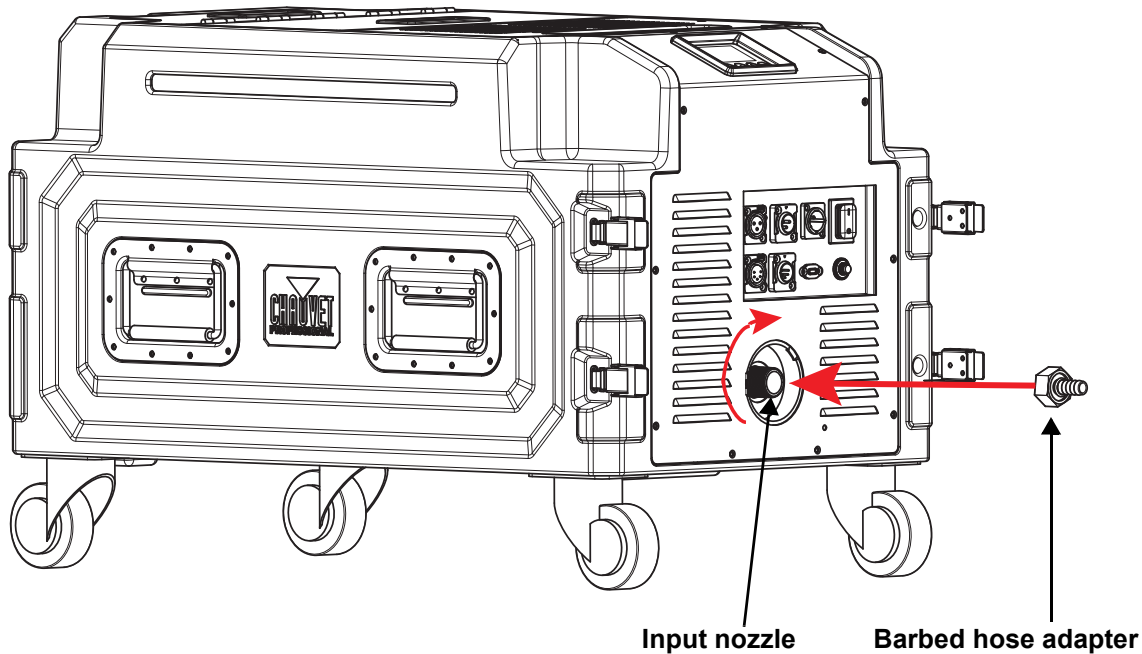


**Tilting the unit may cause internal water migration and system malfunction. This product should be level while operating. Drain all the water before transporting or storing.**

## Barbed Hose Adapter Attachment

The Cloud 9X IP comes with a barbed hose adapter that attaches to the input nozzle for easy filling of the product's primary water tank.

1. Attach the barbed hose adapter to the product by turning it clockwise onto the input nozzle.
2. Attach a pressurized water line (not included) to the barbed end of the adapter to begin filling the primary water tank, without the use of a water pump.



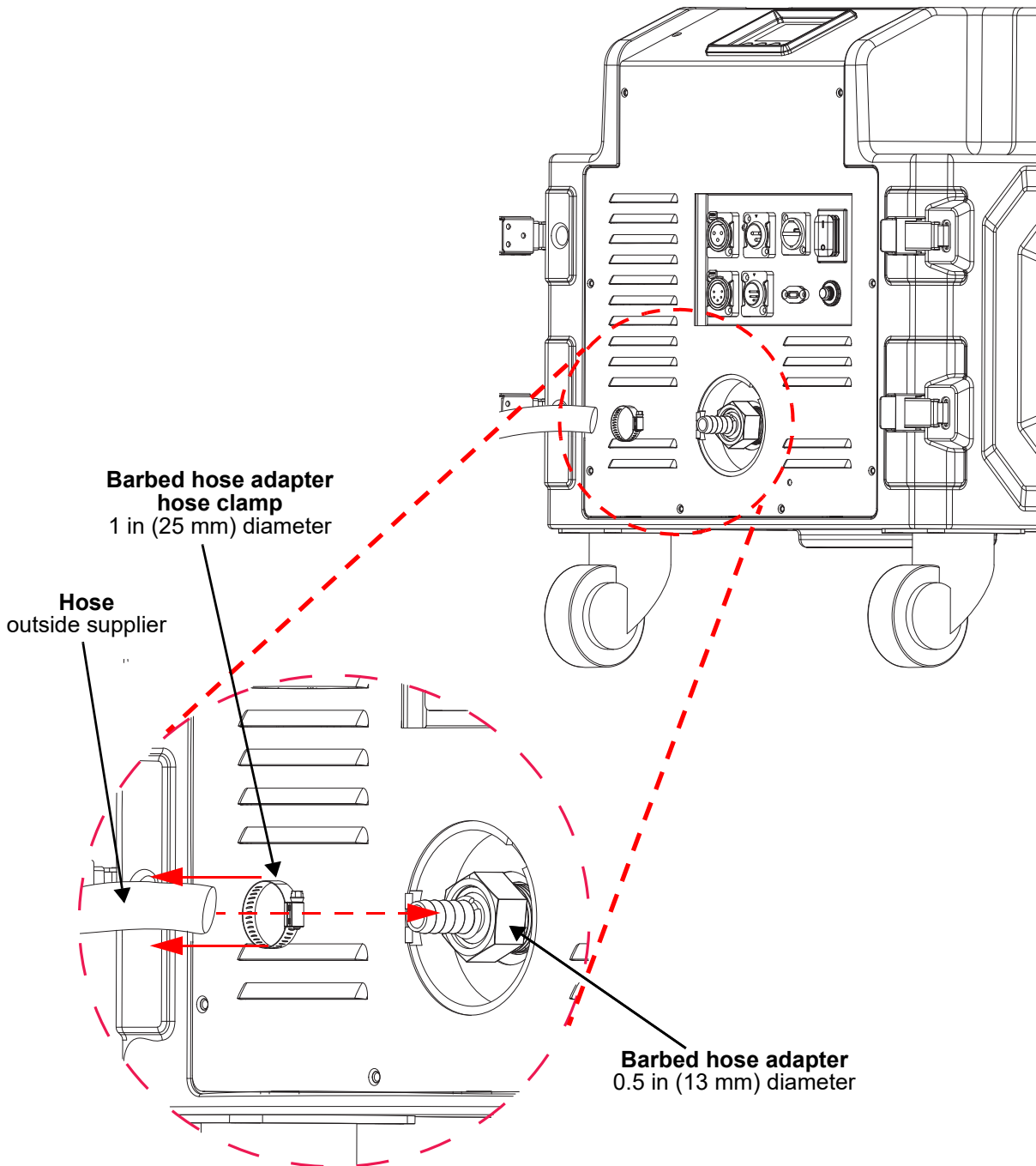
The Cloud 9X IP does not contain an onboard water pump. The unit's internal water tank can be refilled by using a pressurized water line.



When filling the primary water tank using a pressurized water line, the Auto-refill menu option on the Main Menu must be turned on to enable continued automatic filling of the tank.

## Attaching the Pressurized Hose

1. Loosen the included hose clamp with a #2 Philips head screwdriver to the diameter of the hose.
2. Slide the clamp over the bare ended hose.
3. Apply a petroleum based lubricant to the internal tip of the hose for easier attachment to the barbed hose adapter.
4. Slide the hose over the barbed hose adapter until fully seated.
5. Slide the hose clamp over the hose and place it over the barbed hose adapter to apply tension.
6. Using a #2 Philips screwdriver, tighten the hose clamp onto the barbed hose adapter.



## Filling The Fluids

The Cloud 9X IP has a primary water tank, a reserve water reservoir, and a fog fluid tank. These must all be filled before operating the unit.

The primary water tank can be filled using two options:

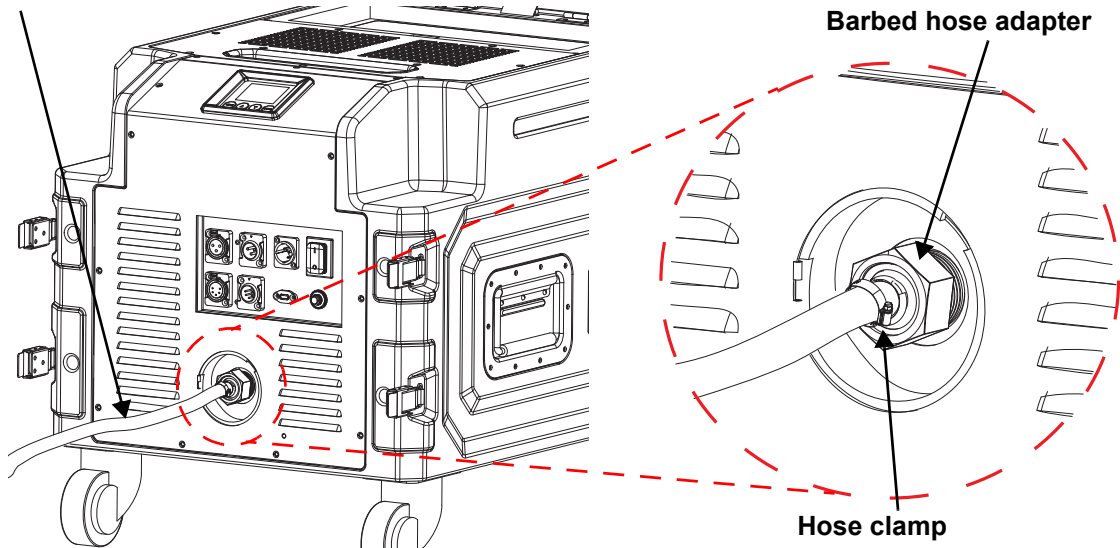
1. Filling the [Reserve Water Reservoir](#).
2. Using a [Pressurized Hose](#) connected to the barbed hose adapter.

### Pressurized Hose

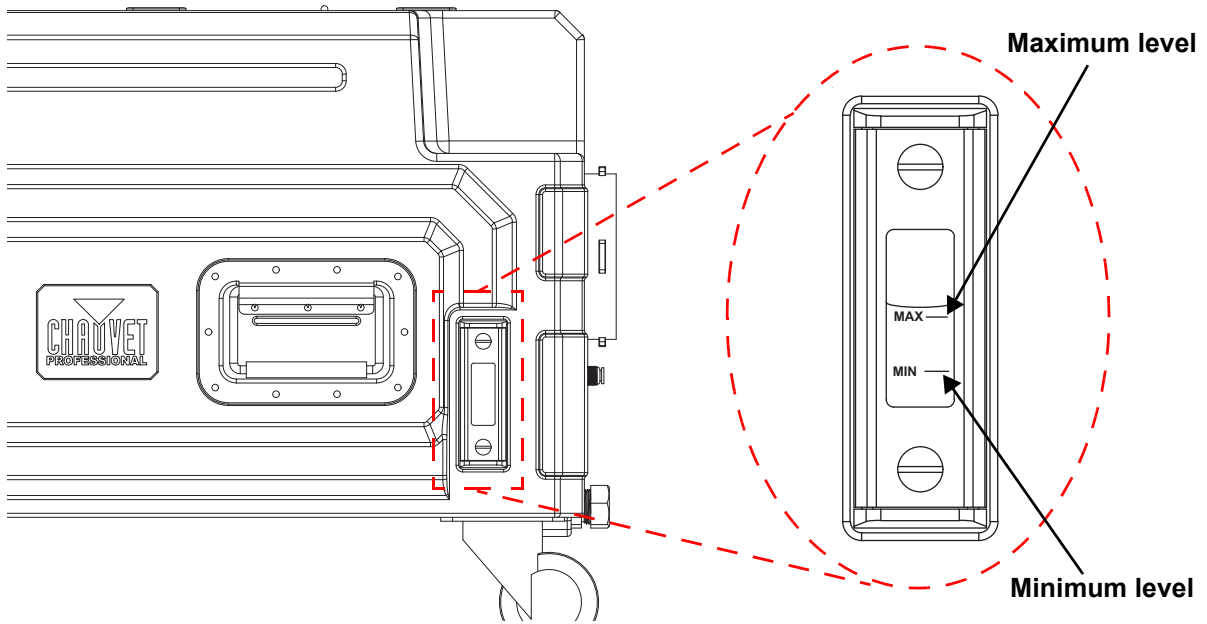
To fill the primary water tank:

1. Attach the barbed hose adapter to the input nozzle.
2. Using the included hose clamp, clamp a pressurized water hose onto the barbed end of the hose adapter.
3. Begin filling the unit with water.

#### Pressurized water hose



4. Fill the primary water tank until the water reaches the **MAX** level line on the indicator.

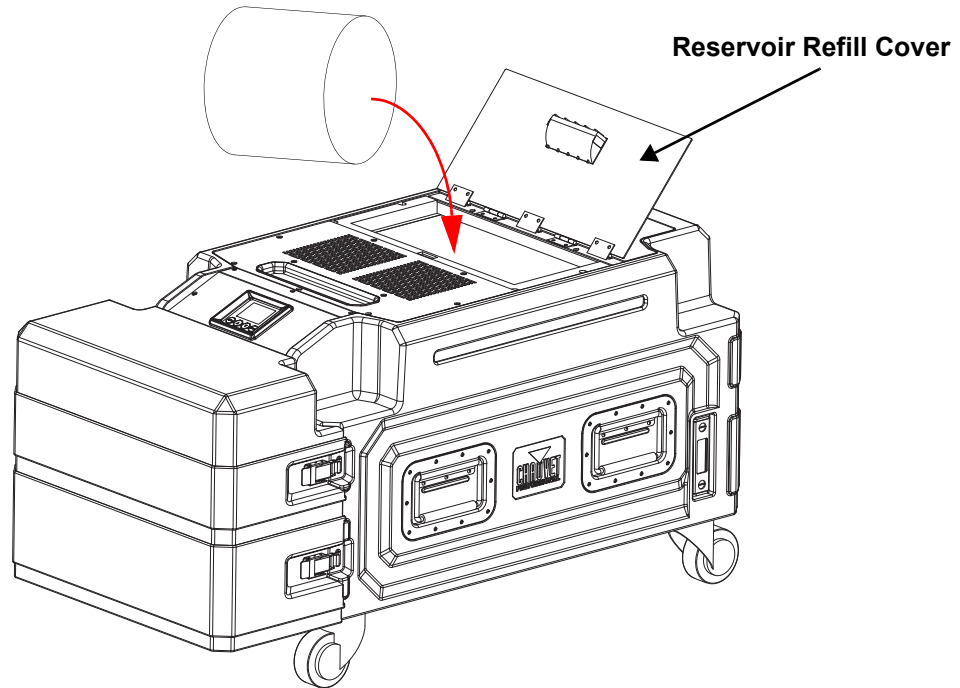


The fluid level indicator is a representation of the physical water level in the primary water tank. It does not connect to the electrical sensor which will cause the unit to start or stop operating depending on the amount of water in the primary water tank.

## Reserve Water Reservoir

To fill the primary water tank using the reserve water reservoir:

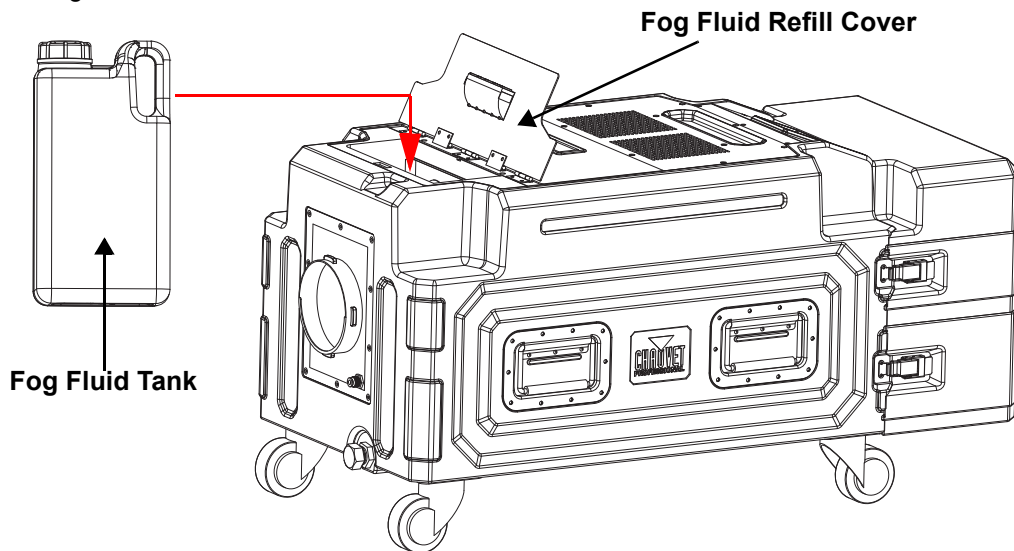
1. Open the reservoir refill cover.
2. Pour water into the reservoir until maximum capacity of the primary water tank has been reached. A valve will close off the primary water tank's opening.
3. Continue adding water to the reservoir until it completely fills, up to 2 gallons.
4. Close the reservoir refill cover.



## Fog Fluid Tank

To fill the fog fluid tank:

1. Open the fog fluid refill cover.
2. Open the fog fluid tank.
3. Fill the tank with LLG or LLFS (EU) fluids.
4. Close the fog fluid tank ensuring the fluid hose is inside the tank.
5. Close the fog fluid refill cover.



## 4. Operation

### Control Panel Description

Button	Function
<MENU>	Exits from the current menu or function
<UP/TIMER>	<b>UP</b> navigates upwards through the menu list and increases the numeric value when in a function. <b>TIMER</b> starts the timer controlled operation.
<DOWN/VOLUME>	<b>DOWN</b> navigates downwards through the menu list and decreases the numeric value when in a function. <b>VOLUME</b> triggers the pump to modify the output volume.
<ENTER/STOP>	<b>ENTER</b> enables the currently displayed menu or sets the currently selected value into the selected function. <b>STOP</b> turns the fog output off.

### Control Options

Set the Cloud 9X IP starting address in the **001-510** DMX range. This enables control of up to 32 products in the 3-channel personality.

## Operation

### DMX Configuration

Use control configurations to operate the product with a DMX controller.



- See the [Starting Address](#) section for the highest selectable starting address for each personality.
- Make sure that the starting addresses on the various products do not overlap due to the new personality setting.

### Starting Address

Each product will respond to a unique starting address from the controller. All products with the same starting address will respond in unison. To set the starting address in DMX mode:

1. Go to the **DMX 512**.
2. Select the starting address (**001–510**).

Connecting a DMX controller to the Cloud 9X IP will automatically navigate to the DMX Starting Address menu.

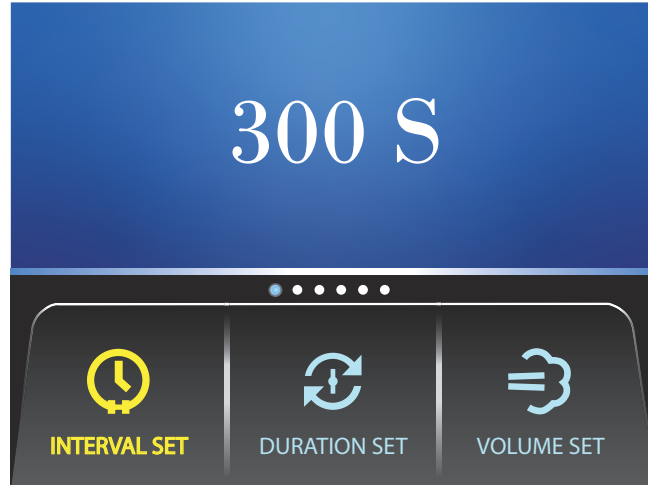


The atomizer combines the water with the fog fluid (LLG) to produce a low-lying fog effect. Channels 2 and 3 should be used in unison to successfully achieve this effect.

## Standalone Configuration

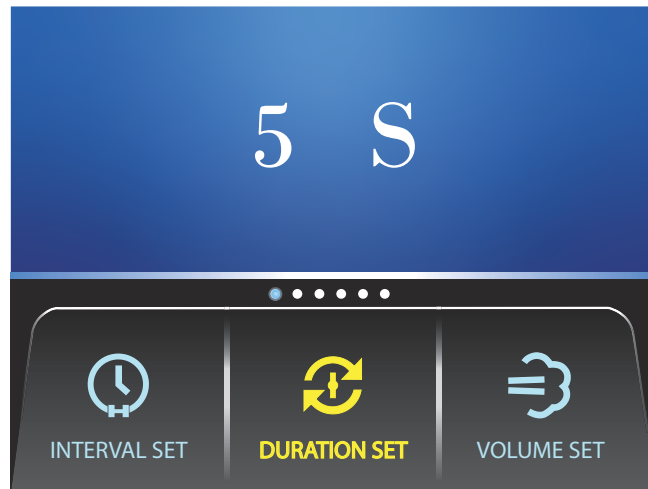
Use standalone configuration to operate the product without a DMX controller. Press menu repeatedly to cycle through each option.

### Interval Set



Press **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select the interval fog output time from **(5-600 S)**

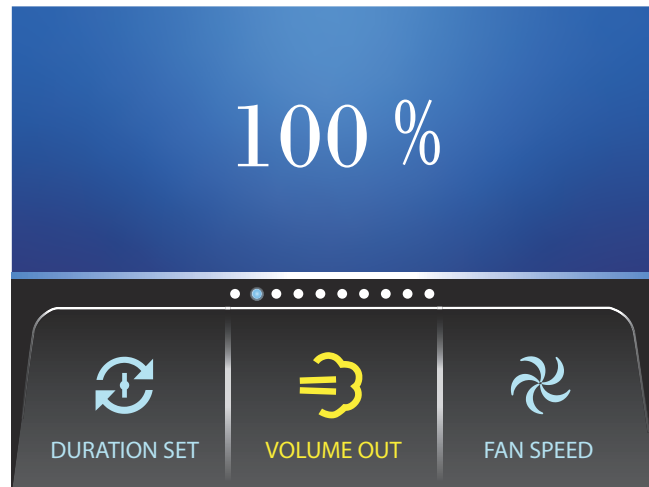
### Duration Set



Press **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select the continuous fog output time from **(5-300S)**.

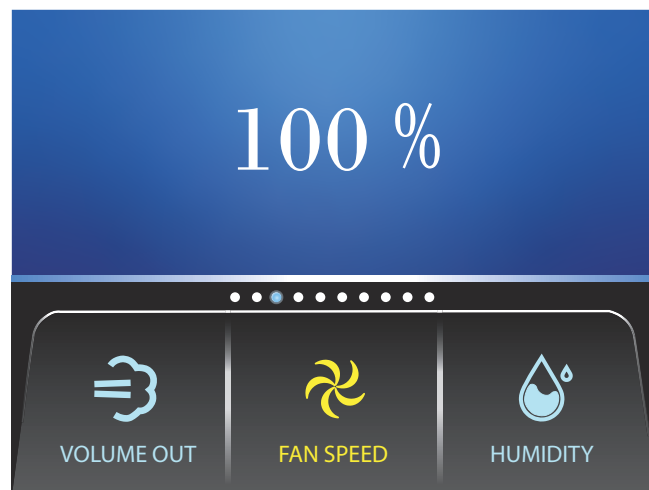
## Operation

### Volume Out



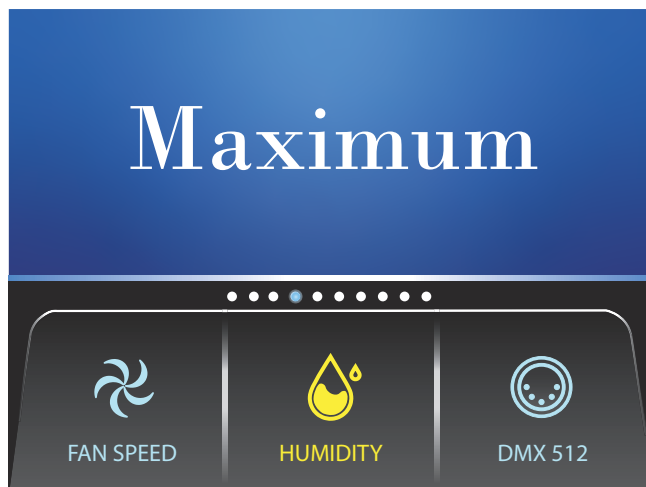
Press **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select the fog output from **1-100%**.

### Fan Speed



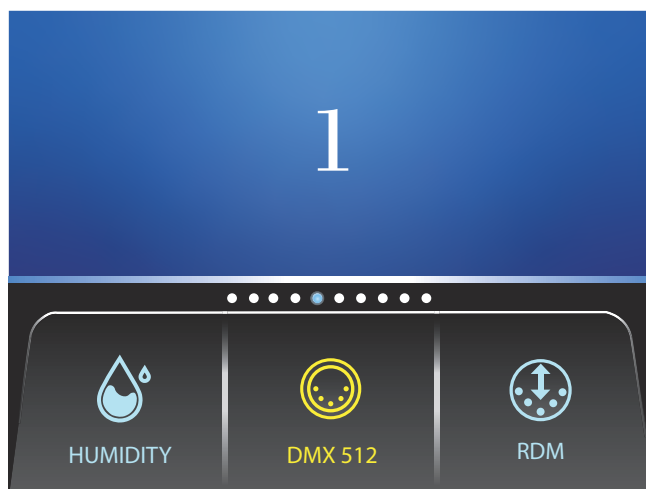
Press **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select the fan speed from **0-100%**. The fan stops working when the value is at **0**.

## Humidity



Press <UP> or <DOWN> to select the humidity output from **OFF**, **Minimum**, **Medium**, or **Maximum**.

## DMX 512



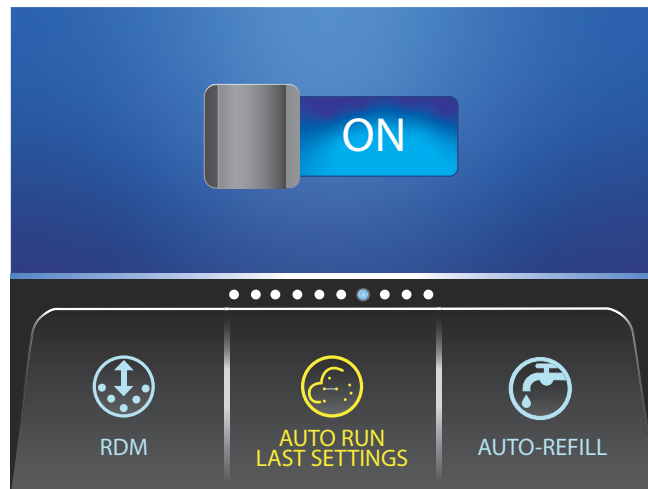
Press <UP> or <DOWN> to select the starting address from **1-510**.

RDM



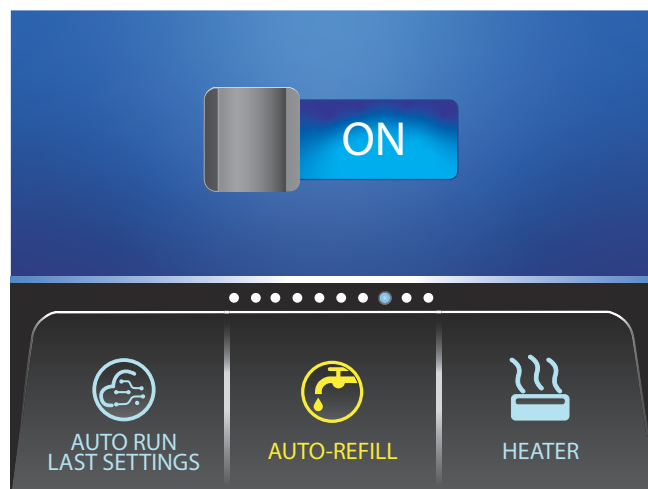
The current RDM ID will appear on the screen.

Auto Run Last Settings



Restore the product to the last working state after a power failure and restart by pressing **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select from **OFF** or **ON**.

## Auto-Refill



Program the auto-refill feature when an external hose is connected to the Cloud 9X IP by pressing **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select from **OFF** or **ON**. Auto-refill requires a pressurized water source connected to the input nozzle.

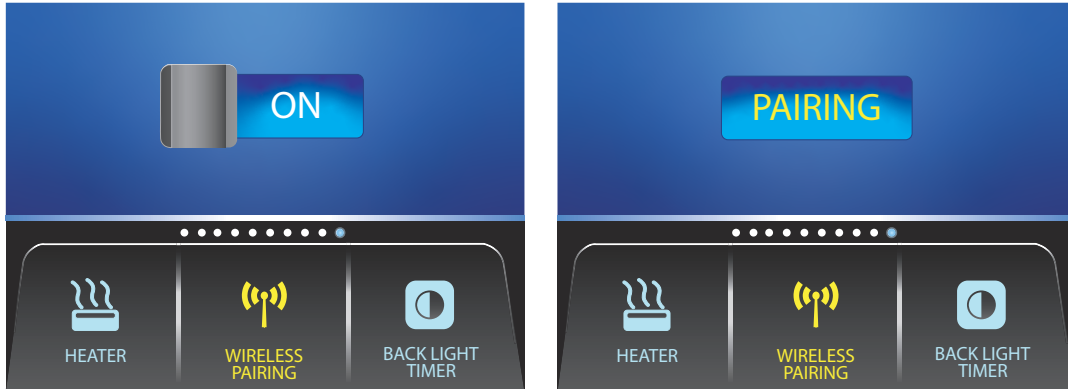
## Heater



Press **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select from **OFF** or **ON**.

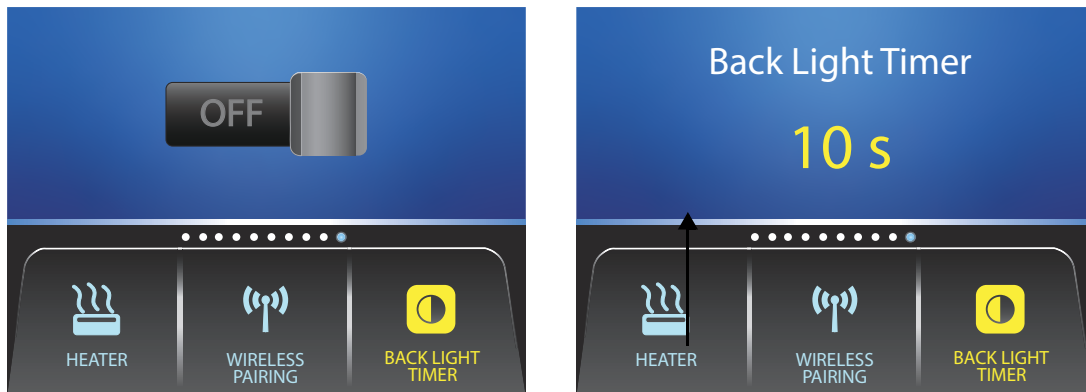
## Operation

### Wireless



Pair the Cloud 9X IP to the wireless remote by pressing **<UP>** or **<DOWN>**. Press and hold the **<ON>** button of the remote when the **<PAIRING>** screen appears.

### Backlight



Control the time duration of the backlight for the LCD display by pressing **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select from **OFF, 10 s, 30 s, or 2 MIN.**

## Timed Output Operation

The Cloud 9X IP offers a timed output operation shortcut screen, which allows easier access to some stand alone functions. To navigate to the Timed Output Operation screen, press **<TIMER>**:



Press **<Menu>** repeatedly to select from **Interval**, **Duration**, **Volume Out**, **Fan Speed**, or **Humidity Out**. Press **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select the desired value.

## Volume Output Operation

The Cloud 9X IP offers a volume output operation shortcut screen, which allows easier access to some stand alone functions. To navigate to the Output Operation screen, press **<VOLUME>**:



Press **<Menu>** repeatedly to select from **Volume Out** or **Fan Speed**. Press **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select the desired value.



## 5. Maintenance

### Fog Machine Maintenance

Proper maintenance of Chauvet atmospheric products will increase the reliability and lifespan of products. Maintenance should be completed every 30-90 days, depending on how frequently products are used.



- **When performing maintenance, use Chauvet Fog Cleaner Quart (FCQ) for U.S., or the cleaning Fluid 250 (CF250) for EU products. Run the fluid through the system to reduce the accumulation of particulate matter in the heating element.**
- **DO NOT allow the atmospheric product to become clogged. Once a product is clogged, the cleaning procedure is unlikely to effectively clear the clog.**

The recommended cleaning procedure is as follows:

1. Unplug the product from power.
2. Remove the hose from the fluid tank/reservoir. Remove the FCQ/CF250 screw cap and place the hose in the Fog Cleaner bottle.
3. Connect the product to power and allow it to warm up (if not already warmed up).
4. Run the FCQ/CF250 through the product in a well-ventilated area for 60-90 seconds of continuous, full output.



**DO NOT allow the product to run dry!**

5. Move the hose from the FCQ/CF250 to a small bottle with water. Run the water through the product for at least 30 seconds to clear any remaining cleaning solution from the pump and heater.



- **Turn off the product when not in use or when storing.**
- **DO NOT leave the cleaning solution in the product.**
- **DO NOT operate the product without fluid at any time.**
- **DO NOT leave Chauvet atmospheric fluid in the product tank/reservoir for more than 10 days without use.**



**Fog Cleaner Quart (FCQ) and Cleaning Fluid 250 (CF250) were specifically developed by Chauvet to clean Chauvet atmospheric products equipped with heaters. Use FCQ/CF250 regularly, no longer than 90 days between cleanings (30-60 days if the product is used more frequently), to prevent shortening the life of the product.**

### Storage

Before storing the Chauvet atmospheric product, run FCQ/CF250 through the system as described in the cleaning procedure above and do not refill the tank with atmospheric fluid before storing the product.



**Test-run the Chauvet atmospheric products monthly to achieve the best performance.**

Chauvet does not guarantee products will withstand storage for long durations, even if the cleaning process is followed. Please use caution and test regularly to ensure the product continues to function properly.
